Napier's average residential rates remain one of the lowest in the country at \$2118 per property.



Improving our water network is our number one priority. There is still work to be done.

So far we have achieved:

- Updated Water Safety Plan signed off by the drinking water assessors

RECYCLING IMPROVEMENTS

from 1 November

Over the past 12 months we have been working to develop a new and improved recycling service.

Thank you to those who have provided feedback through the Waste Management Minimisation Plan (WMMP) 2018-24, the Long Term Plan 2018-2028 and Annual Plan consultation, for what a new recycling service should look like for Napier. It is clear from what our community has told us that kerbside recycling is an important service and that a three crate system would be valued.

Based on the outcome of the consultation, we are pleased to be delivering the following recycling enhancements from **1 November**.

WHAT'S NEW?

1 Your new recycling crates will be delivered soon!

During October each property rated for recycling will receive three new recycling crates. Use these new crates to put out your kerbside recycling on your collection day from 1 November.

2 Weekly collections

From 1 November, your recycling will be collected weekly, rather than fortnightly.

Please don't overfill your crates

Only fill your crates so they are level or below the top.

The crate labels make it easy to know what goes where.

GLASS BOTTLES & JARS

PLASTIC (1 & 2) & CANS

No food or liquids

Remove all food, liquids and plastic wrap/sleeves. Rinse items if required.
