Consultation closing soon!



Public consultation on our Three-Year Plan is closing soon. The plan sets out what Council is going to deliver, how it will go about it and how much it is likely to cost.

Our proposed three-year programme will help our community recover from the impacts of the cyclone and put us on firm foundations for the years ahead. We're considering significant changes to the way we do things to benefit the wellbeing of everyone in Napier.

There are six specific proposals the public are being asked for their views on during the consultation. These are the future of council-owned housing, maintaining a rate to build resilience, how council investments should be managed, increases to fees and charges, how certain tourist facilities should be funded and the future of council office accommodation.

The most important part of this plan is you. Your voice and your views will make this draft plan a solid road map for the next three years.

The Three-Year Plan consultation closes at 5pm on Friday 26 April, so don't delay. Submissions can be made through sayitnapier.nz. This is the quickest and easiest way to have your say. Hard copy information is available from Taradale and Napier Libraries, or at the Customer Service Centre at 215 Hastings Street, Napier.


Solar Tsunamis Exhibition
