DECISION

1. Introduction

This is an application by **TREVORS CAFE LIMITED** for a Temporary Authority in respect of the premises situated at 28 Tennyson Street, Napier South, Napier and currently known as 'Art Deco Bistro'.

The application comes about from a change of ownership and is required to allow the applicant to continue trading while the application for a new licence is processed by the Licensing Committee. This is the **second** Temporary Authority made by the applicant against the licence.

2. Application

The application is made against on-licence **030/ON/1426/2020** which has an expiry date of 27 April 2022.

The application was not advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received under section 103 of the Act. Accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers in accordance with sections 136 and 202(1) of the Act.

In considering the application for temporary authority the committee had regard to the object of the Act and reports furnished by Police and Inspector.

3. Reporting Agencies

The following reports were received under the Act.

Police Report – No opposition from Police.

Licensing Inspector Report – The inspector notes that the applicant is a private company with two directors/shareholders and the applications notes there is one named certified manager.

The Inspector notes the applicant has yet to make their substantive on-licence application although they did produce an application which was incomplete. The Inspector rightly notes the purpose of a Temporary Authority in his report and also notes some of the Authorities case law on the matter. The Inspector further states that if a third temporary authority is applied for by the applicant, he will oppose it.

The inspector concludes that the application is complete and meets the criteria of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.

I concur with the inspector's assessment and I think the Inspectors report sends a strong message to the applicant that they have three months to get their substantive application sorted.

4. Decision

Accordingly the application for a second Temporary Licence is **Approved**, valid for 3 months from the expiry date of first temporary authority or when the Substantive Licence Application lodged by the applicant is determined, whichever is the sooner.

The Temporary Authority can be issued with the standard conditions pertaining to Temporary Authorities.
