COFFEE WITH a Councillor

Hayley Browne has made a few career switches, from chemical engineer to naval officer to winemaker. And in the past year she has added mother and councillor to the list.

"I stood for Council because I feel really strongly about social duty. I have known what it is like to be treated without dignity and respect and will do what I can to make sure as many people as possible are treated with dignity and respect."

Hayley's five-year battle with the New Zealand and British governments, which was well publicised, came to an end last year. She had already announced her intention to run for Council at that stage.

"Council has a big impact on our day to day lives but I don't think many people realise this."

She has worked on water systems before, and her career included taking technical engineering "speak" and translating it to help laypeople with their decision making. "I see that skill as being quite helpful as we transition through this process of what people expect from our water," she says.

She worked at the Tiwai smelter during her holidays while studying at Canterbury University, then spent 18 months in a research position in Tasmania.

Following her stint with the Royal New Zealand Navy, Hayley did a post-graduate

Diploma in Oenology (winemaking) part-time through EIT. Her studies included marketing, and she created her own brand. The names embodied the flavour of the wine in a 50s pin-up style but it was about empowerment rather than objectification. Hence the names Betty Bubbles, Penny Noir, Savannah Blanc, Greta Gris, and Ruby Rosé.

Originally from Southland, Hayley is married to Dan, who has his own video production company. Their daughter Tilly (Matilda) is eight months old. Tilly was two months old when Hayley began her election campaign in earnest.

Her Council portfolio is Community Resilience, and special roles, including external appointments and joint committees, comprise the Clifton to Tangoio Coastal Hazards Strategy joint committee, Historic Places HB Inc, the Ahuriri Business Association, and Port Noise Liaison committee.

"I love the engineering approach to problem solving and I would really like to see how we can apply that to social problems. One of the key things that gets missed quite a lot of the time is that people don't spend enough time getting to the root cause of problems."

Marine Parade Deco Shuttle - from the Spirit of Napier to Albion St, 100m from the Soundshell, Friday 21 February 5pm-midnight, Sat 22 February 10am-midnight, Sun 21 Feb 10am-5pm.

Ahuriri-CBD Deco Shuttle - Operates every half hour from the bus stop outside the Bluewater Hotel, finishes Browning St, outside Conservation House, same times as above.

TENDER IS THE NIGHT MTG Hawke's Bay Exhibition

Examining the life & times of the "lost generation" – young people who lived through WWI & lost faith & belief in traditional values, or suffered from "survivors' guilt". The result was living fast, living in the moment, and an almost manic determination to party. Featuring beautiful frocks, memorabilia including film footage, and some thought provoking commentary about the era's influences, including the ultimately doomed author F Scott Fitzgerald and his wife Zelda Sayre, one of America's first flappers, and the movement's connection to women's rights.

A guided tour of the 1931 earthquake gallery sets the scene for enjoying an exhibition dedicated to Art Deco. Available 11am, 19, 20, 21 February.
