
ARE YOU EXPERIENCING DIRTY WATER?

Why do we get dirty water?

Our water source, the Heretaunga Aquifer, has naturally occurring manganese – one of the most abundant metals in the earth's crust.

When manganese-laden water mixes with oxygen and chlorine, the manganese oxidises or changes state to manganese dioxide, a black solid that can coat the inside of pipes.





Manganese has always been present in our water network. Dirty water is now more of an issue due to the manganese reacting with the chlorine we've been adding to our water since 2017.

In Napier, this affects certain suburbs (Tamatea, Onekawa and Pirimai) more than others because of different water pressure and flow rates, and because there are higher levels of manganese in the aquifer bores that supply these suburbs.



PUBLIC HEALTH NOTICE

Some older plumbing fittings have the potential to allow minute traces of metals to accumulate in water standing in fittings for several hours.

Although the health risk is small, the Ministry of Health recommends that you flush a mugful of water from your drinking-water tap each morning before use to remove any metals that may have dissolved from plumbing fittings.

We are recommending this simple precaution for all households, including those on public and private water supplies.
