## STORMWATER make sure only rain goes down the drain

When it rains you see those little rivers running along the gutter. That water is entering our stormwater system. From here it'll head out to sea, 70 per cent of it via our treasured Ahuriri Estuary. Meaning? Whatever it gets mixed up with - engine oil, sawdust, sediment, chemicals, car wash detergents, dog poo, cigarette butts, anything plastic - will end up in Ahuriri. We're spending \$20.6 million over the next decade to improve our stormwater system, but we need your help.

#### THIS IS WHAT WE CAN DO TOGETHER - TO HELP RESTORE OUR ESTUARY.



#### SOLUTION

USE WEEKLY KERBSIDE RUBBISH COLLECTION, DISPOSE OF CHEMICALS THROUGH AN AUTHORISED WASTE COLLECTOR, INSTALL SEDIMENT & EROSION CONTROL MEASURES ON EARTHWORKS SITES, WASH VEHICLES ON LAWNS OR USE A PROPER CARWASH FACILITY.



#### SOLUTION

KEEP YOUR SEPTIC TANKS SERVICED & MAINTAINED.



#### RAINFALL IS PLUMBED TO THE WASTEWATER SYSTEM ON SOME PROPERTIES WHICH CAUSES OVERFLOWS

SOLUTION

CHECK THAT GULLY TRAPS OUTSIDE DON'T ACCEPT RAINFALL, WHICH COULD OVERWHELM THE WASTEWATER/SEWERAGE NETWORK.



#### SPILLS HAPPEN AND WE DON'T GET TOLD FAST ENOUGH

#### SOLUTION

ALWAYS PUT RUBBISH IN A BIN, PICK UP ANY THAT YOU SEE. ONLY PUT OUT RUBBISH ON THE MORNING OF YOUR COLLECTION DAY.



#### CIGARETTE BUTTS CONTAIN ENVIRONMENTALLY HARMFUL CHEMICALS

#### SOLUTION

USE A PROPER CIGARETTE DISPOSAL AREA, ENSURE CIGARETTES ARE STUBBED OUT FULLY, THEN PLACE IN A RUBBISH BIN.



## RUSTY ROOFS

SOLUTION

KEEP PAINTED TO AVOID RUSTING, MAINTAIN AND TOUCH-UP AREAS WHEN RUST STARTS TO APPEAR, PURCHASE INERT ROOFING TYPES WHEN REPLACING YOUR ROOF.



#### SEDIMENT, GRASS, SAWDUST, DIRT & LEAVES CHANGE WATER QUALITY

#### SOLUTION

ALWAYS CONTAIN WHERE POSSIBLE AND DISPOSE OF RESPONSIBLY.



#### KERBSIDE RECYCLING BLOWS AWAY

#### SOLUTION

PUT RECYCLING OUT ON THE DAY OF YOUR COLLECTION, PUT LIGHTER RECYCLABLES AT THE BOTTOM OF BINS, AND HEAVIER RECYCLING ON TOP.



CHEMICALS MIX WITH WATER AND TRAVEL TO THE ESTUARY

SOLUTION

ONLY APPLY ENOUGH FERTILIZER OR SPRAY TO DO THE JOB, EXPLORE NON-CHEMICAL METHODS OF WEED CONTROL AND FERTILISING.

# Ministry of Health PUBLIC HEALTH NOTICE

Some older plumbing fittings have the potential to allow minute traces of metals to accumulate in water standing in fittings for several hours.

Although the health risk is small, the Ministry of Health recommends that you flush a mugful of water from your drinking-water tap each morning before use to remove any metals that may have dissolved from plumbing fittings.

We are recommending this simple precaution for all households, including those on public and private water supplies.

## WASTE AND WATER PROJECTS FOCUS FOR 2019/20

The Annual Plan 2019/20 was adopted by Council on 28 June 2019, with a 6.4% average rates increase. Waste and water projects are the main priorities for the year ahead.

#### Waste management

Council agreed to continue to subsidise kerbside recycling collection, which will be covered by funding from our reserves.

#### Water projects

Council confirmed that water is its number one priority, with \$7.8 million of additional drinking water network projects brought forward. This brings our total spending on Three Waters (drinking water, stormwater and wastewater) in 2019/20 to over \$37m.

Council also approved \$200,000 for an independent review to investigate options and costings for the supply of a citywide unchlorinated water network, which must meet new national drinking water regulations.
