## **Kaitiaki of Napier City**

Launched in June 2022, Napier Assist Āwhina Tāngata is a group of dedicated kaitiaki (guardians) who offer locals and visitors a helping hand, to ensure everyone has a safe and enjoyable experience in Napier. The team of nine works closely with local Police, Napier City Business Inc. and retailers, as well as keeping in touch with community hubs such as the Outreach centre and LIFT.

## New Homebase for Pacific Surf Lifeguards

#### **Goal: Ngā tangata | People** Our people are safe and prepared

Napier's Hardinge Road, home of the locally famous eatery, Hot Chick, is now also home to surf lifeguards from the Pacific Surf Lifesaving Club. Surf lifeguards are patrolling this stretch of shore, which includes Ahuriri and Port beaches, from December until March 2023. The move is a change in location from their usual patrols on Marine Parade, which has been labelled unsafe for swimming. The decision followed a report by Surf Life Saving New Zealand that identified a need for lifeguard patrols at the busy Ahuriri beach and reduced need for patrols at Marine Parade, due to low numbers of beach users.

Napier City Council has installed permanent water safety signs along the 11km stretch of Marine Parade and will continue to install additional signage along the remainder of Napier's coastline. The Council has been running a summer water safety campaign to tell beachgoers of the dangers of the beach and share information about Pacific's new patrols. ## **A Resilient Westshore**

#### Goal: Ngā wāhi | Place

We have safe homes, roads and public spaces.

What makes a resilient community? And what makes a resilient Westshore? These topics were up for discussion when the Westshore Residents and Development Association met with the Hawke's Bay Civil Defence Emergency Management Group in November. The purpose of the hui was to create a community resilience plan in partnership with civil defence. Westshore is one of a group of coastal Napier communities to put together a resilience plan, with more to come. Other partners involved in the workshop were Eastern District Police, Hawke's Bay - Fire and Emergency, Napier City Council, Hawke's Bay Airport, Westshore Primary School, Surf Lifesaving NZ, Napier Neighbourhood Support and award-winning Kate Boersen from Illuminate Science.

## **Drive Nice Napier**

#### Goal: Ngā wāhi | Place

Napier City Council worked with FOLKL, a local research company, to deliver a simple, interactive campaign encouraging more courteous driving behaviour in Napier. The Drive Nice Napier campaign, which ran between May and August 2022, asked people to share instances of good driving through social media or text. This entered them in the draw to win spot prizes, with the driver they nominated up for a chance to win a grand prize of a \$4,000 EVO Cycles voucher.
